### **DR. WHO FILM SHOOTS AT G-STAR STUDIOS**

The fabled British TV show, Dr. Who, has come to the G-Star Studios in West Palm Beach to shoot its first film. For over 20 years, British and American television audiences alike have thrilled to the time-traveling escapades of the cerebral Doctor Who while he has saved the earth many times over on the BBC and PBS networks. The story allows for a new actor to play Doctor Who as he reincarnates himself into a new body every few years. The TV show today is broadcast on the Sci-Fi Channel and BBC.

The film entitled, Dr. Who: A Survivor's Triangle, stars John Reid Adams (Film Contest?) as the venerable Dr. Who, with Jeffery Breslauer (From the Earth to the Moon, Wiseguy, Police Academy 5) and Darryl Baldwin (The Evil Within, original Terminator in Universal Studios T2-3D Battle Across Time, key stunt actor as the bald-headed German bad guy in Disney MGM Studios Indiana Jones Epic Stunt Spectacular). The sci-fi action-adventure film has Director Harrison Biswas at the helm and is lensed by Brian Zazzara, Director of Photography. Principal photography wraps in August 2007.

"Filming at G-Star has been a wonderful experience," states John Reid Adams, who is also the Producer of the film. "This is an incredible facility to shoot in. We plan to bring the next film back to shoot here again." As a gift to G-Star, the Producer donated Dr. Who's "Tardis" time machine to the school. The time machine will be used in the student produced X-Scream Halloween extravaganza this October where thousands of people will walk a haunted movie studio and travel through time into the past and the future.

Dr. Who: A Survivor's Triangle is the thirteenth film to be shot at the G-Star Studios since it opened three years ago.
